How old-school bhangra is influencing South Asian music today

When you think of bhangra music, high-energy, rhythmic and heavy beats probably come to mind.

But it hasn't always been this way - the genre's been around a while and has its roots in traditional folk music.

Back then male and female duets, and sounds of the harmonium, accordion and guitar were the key features of its signature style.

Since the 1970s and 1980s - considered a golden age - bhangra has been adapted and fused with modern urban melodies.

As the genre moved forward the duets that helped to shape it seemed to go out of fashion.

But they could be making a comeback.

British Asian record producer Manni Sandhu is the man behind recent number one single Forever. The track, featuring a duet between singers Tegi Pannu and Prem Lata, was top of the Official British Asian Chart for five weeks in a row.

It was also streamed more than 30 million times across Spotify and YouTube combined, and peaked at number two in the global Asian music chart.

"The duet phase is definitely coming back," Manni tells BBC Asian Network.

'It's gone totally berserk'

Manni feels Forever's popularity is down to an increased appetite for the type of Punjabi folk music which was popular decades ago.

"Our industry definitely went through a phase where we were



trying to imitate and be more like the Western side," he says.

"But it was never going to make it that way because that's not authentic

"I feel like the music coming out recently in the last six or seven months has definitely got a much more traditional sound to it."

Manni says Forever's beats are still "a little bit urban", but the vocals and lyrics have an "authentic old-school kind of folk Punjabi feel".

"I'm glad the music is more of a folk sound because that's what it should be," he adds.

That original folk sound was heavily influenced by Amar Singh Chamkila, described as the "Elvis of Punjab" in the 1980s.

His story was captured in Netflix biopic Chamkila, starring Diljit Dosanjh - arguably the biggest Punjabi artist in the world right now.

Many of Amar Singh Chamkila's

hits were duets with Amarjot, played by Bollywood star Parineeti Chopra in the film.

A month after the film's release, rapper and songwriter Raja Kumari released In Love, a traditional duet-style song with Guru Randhawa.

The music video was shot in Punjab and has over 37 million views on YouTube.

"We're all going back to seeing the classics and understanding what was so special about that," she tells BBC Asian Network.

Indian-American Raja has previously collaborated with artists including Iggy Azalea, Fifth Harmony, Sidhu Moose Wala and Fall Out Boy, but says "everyone is always trying to get back to the roots".

"The amount of love that I've received from the Punjabi community for this song. It just encourages me to keep trying doing more," she says.

And she feels it's important to preserve the original sounds for a younger audience.
"I hope that when people do see

"I hope that when people do see these modern duets, it makes them go back and understand where it comes from."

This resurgence isn't limited to mainstream music.

Since the release of the Netflix film, a Chamkila and Amarjot tribute act say they've received an increasing number of bookings around the world.

Banger and Sammy, whose group is called Sadi Jori, say the rise in popularity was noticeable when they performed in India.

"It got to a point where you couldn't see anything because there were so many people," Sammy says.

"It took us two minutes to get from our car to the stage. But to get from the stage back to our car, it took us two hours.

"It's not a fashion. I think it's always been there, but now it's coming to the forefront and people are proud of it."

Banger says they've been getting bookings in places where Chamkila originally performed, as well as Dubai, Bulgaria, Australia and

"Punjabi music duet singing is definitely back, it's gone through the roof.

"It's always been there for me, but recently, it's just erupted and gone totally berserk," Banger says.

Province supports search-and-rescue teams for a safer backcountry

The Province is providing nearly \$6 million to the B.C. Search and Rescue Association (BCSARA) so that ground search-and-rescue (GSAR) groups can continue to have the training, equipment and resources they need to help keep peo-

B.C.'s GSAR groups are at their busiest this time of year, between keeping people safe in the backcountry and assisting with wildfire evacuations in the prov-

"We are incredibly proud and grateful for our provsearch-and-rescue ince's teams who work tirelessly to ensure the safety and well-being of people in need," said Bowinn Ma, Minister of Emergency Management and Climate Readiness. "In addition to reimbursements for operational expenses, this funding helps B.C.'s 78 GSAR groups and 3,000 volunteers access the training and resources they need to carry out their vital work of



keeping people safe." The annual funding builds on steps the Province has taken to improve the tools, resources and training available to GSAR, including making it easier for search-and-rescue groups to add capabilities, such as search dogs, to their teams. Additionally, work is underway to complete a needs and gap analysis to determine where new capabilities are required to meet operational needs of keeping people safe.

"BCSARA and the GSAR groups appreciate the continued support of the Province," said Chris Mushumanski, president, BCSARA. "The annual funding is a result of the collaborative relationship we have together cultivated over decades. The benefits of this sustainable funding are put to good use by the incredibly dedicated volunteers in the GSAR groups daily, and includes our Adventure Hub public education and prevention program as well as the Critical Incident Stress Management (CISM) men-

tal-health program."
This is the third year of the annual funding agreement between the Province and the BC Search and Rescue Association, which is the only agreement of its kind in Canada. In addition

to this sustained annual funding, the Province also provides incident-related reimbursements to GSAR groups to cover operational search-and-rescue costs, which amounted to nearly

\$5.5 million in 2023-24. "During an unfortunate situation where I was unable to get off North Star Hill in Kimberley, BCSARA was called," said Ali Currie-Bell, a visitor from Calgary area who was assisted by GSAR. "They stayed in constant contact, reassuring and comforting us. Their calm handling of the situation and quick action got me the medical care I needed. I am grateful for everything they did to get us home safely.

During emergencies and other urgent situations, GSAR groups provide critical assistance to requesting agencies, such as the police and BC Emergency Health Services. GSAR groups were deployed to 1865 incidents in B.C. in 2023 and to 1030 incidents to date in 2024.

Search for bodies after India landslide buried hundreds

Landslides that hit the southern Indian state of Kerala earlier this week have killed 196 people. More than 200 people are still missing and some 9,000 people have been moved to relief camps. BBC Tamil's Muralitharan Kasiviswanathan reports from the badly hit district of Wayanad.

"Have you seen this girl or her body?"

Clutching a mobile phone close to her heart, a woman goes from village to village, asking people the same question.

Warning: This story contains details that some readers may find distressing.

She shows two pictures of her niece Anita, who is missing. In one, Anita is flashing the victory sign as she poses happily with her aunt. The nine-year-old moved to live with her after the death of her mother a few years ago.

The other photo shows a disfigured body on the ground.

The woman, who was too traumatised to disclose her name, said she received the picture on WhatsApp from some friends who thought it was Anita

Since then, she has been



trying to locate her niece, but hasn't been successful. She is not sure if Anita is dead or alive.

Her story resembles that of many others who are desperately searching for their loved ones.

Nearly 200 people are still missing after vast swathes of the area were flattened by thick torrents of mud and water on Tuesday.

The disaster stuck at 2am as

most people slept, giving them little chance to escape. Wayanad is known for its cardamom plantations and tea estates and has several

popular tourist spots. Hundreds of plantation workers live here with their families in makeshift houses made of tin and clay.

On Thursday, rescue officials said that all the people trapped in tea plantations had been rescued and chances of finding more survivors were slim.

They added that rescuing people and retrieving bodies were proving to be difficult due to heavy rains that were continuing to lash the area.

Their operations were also affected because the bridge that connected the

badly affected villages of Chooralmala and Mundakkai was washed off.

Officials have now constructed a temporary metal bridge to ferry equipment to the affected areas.

The BBC also witnessed scenes of chaos as anxious relatives waited outside a school where some of the unidentified bodies have been kept.

Amaravati, who narrowly survived the landslides, is still in shock. She is from the neighbouring Tamil Nadu state, but has been living in Chooralmala for years.

"It had been raining continuously for two days. When the first landslide struck, we went to our daughter's house, which was a short distance away," she said.

But when they got there, they saw "mud and debris everywhere".

The family fled to a nearby coffee plantation and took shelter there for the night. But her husband's brother

and nephew were not as lucky. Landslides buried their house and Amaravati and her family are now trying to identify their bodies.

Ponnaiyan, who ran a tailoring shop in the area, said he and his family

narrowly escaped death on the fateful night.

"But many of my neighbours, relatives and friends, who were sleeping peacefully in the night, have all died," he added.

When rains became too heavy, Ponnaiyan took his family to his shop thinking they would be safer there. But soon, an electric pole fell on the shop's shutter and water started flooding in.

"When I opened the door, I saw water and mud washing away everything on the road. I thought we would die there," he recalled.

After they had walked for about half-a-mile in kneedeep mud, the ground collapsed again. The family then climbed up on to a nearby mound, from where they were rescued by officials. The next morning, he decided to go back and check on his friends and neighbours.

"But everything and everyone had been washed away," he said.

Almost everyone in the area had similar stories to tell. Many families have accepted that their missing loved ones are dead but some are still clinging on to hopes of a miracle.

CRICKET LEGEND SHASTRI HONOURED BY CARDIFF MET

Former India and Glamorgan allrounder Ravi Shastri has been made an honorary fellow by Cardiff Metropolitan University.

The award was presented at a special event at Glamorgan's Sophia Gardens ground and recognised Shastri's contribution to cricket as a world-class player, coach and commentator during a career spanning more than 40 years.

"It is a great honour," said Shastri.
"It is something I never imagined when I played here long ago that would happen.

would happen.
"I enjoyed my time playing for Glamorgan here in Cardiff and it is a pleasure to be back."

Shastri, 62, played for India between 1981 and 1992 and performed a pivotal role in their 1983 World Cup victory.



He is one of only five players in the history of the Test game to have completed the hat-trick of scoring 3,000 runs, taking 150 wickets and compiling 10 centuries.

Shastri was the first Indian batter to hit six sixes in an over when he completed the feat for Mumbai against Baroda in the 1985-86 Ranji Trophy season.

He joined Glamorgan in 1987 and spent four seasons in Wales. In 1988, he played a key role in the team's run to the semi-finals of the Benson & Hedges Cup.

After retiring from international cricket, Shastri transitioned into a successful career as a commentator. He was also a Unicef ambassador for a decade, championing the 'Pulse-Polio' campaign until India eventually eradicated polio.

In 2017, hé became India's head coach, guiding the team to an historic Test series win in Australia that led to

them becoming the number one team in the world.

'Reap future rewards'

Shastri celebrated his achievement alongside his wife, Ritu, and daughter Alekha, and several of his former playing colleagues at Glamorgan including his former captain Hugh Morris.

Ex-Glamorgan captain Tony Lewis, who persuaded Shastri to sign for the Welsh county, was also in attendance, alongside current club president Alan Wilkins who has commentated alongside Shastri.

"Ravi and I have been great friends over many years and I was very pleased to play a part in bringing him and Cardiff Metropolitan University together," said Wilkins.

B.C. supports seniors aging at home with new virtual service

Seniors will be supported to stay in their homes longer with a new virtual service that provides some of the essential support of a longterm care facility in their own home.

'Seniors prefer to live in their own home receiving supports and assistance, in a space that is familiar and comfortable," said Adrian Dix, Minister of Health. "This innovative long-term care at home approach provides seniors and their loved ones with the services they need to age safely and independently for as long as possible."

The Long-term Care at program (LTC@ Home Home) equips seniors' homes with technology for virtual care and monitoring, customized to an individual's needs and monitored by a care team who checks in if an alert is received. It also includes respite care to help alleviate family caregiver burnout, extending their ability to care for a loved one in the home longer.

Similar to long-term care residence monitoring, the programs' technology will monitor seniors in their homes for fall detection, activity levels, medication adherence, wandering and vitals where appropriate to the individual.

"This virtual program will empower seniors to age in the comfort of their own



homes," said Harwinder Sandhu, Parliamentary Secretary for Seniors' Services and Long-Term Care. "By embracing new solutions and tailored support, our government continues to take action to ensure the safety of seniors, so they can age with dignity and security. This new program will provide comfort and assurance to seniors and their families by delivering the quality health care needed to age in place."

A variety of devices may be used for equipping a senior's home. Examples include a tablet for connecting to loved ones or participating in virtual programs, a wearable pendant

or wall mounted device for fall detection, two-way emergency calls, and sensors installed throughout the home. The combination of devices used is tailored to the seniors' home and health needs, ensuring they are safe wherever they are in their home.

"This program will give seniors in Saanich South and throughout B.C. the long-term care support they need within their own homes, keeping them safe and providing their loved ones with peace of mind," said Lana Popham, MLA for Saanich South.

The LTC@Home program is designed to support seniors who feel this is a viable solution for them, and whose care needs meet at least one of the following criteria:

on or eligible for long-term care wait list and is living at home with a primary caregiver (family or friend); on or eligible for assisted living wait list and is living at home; or

living at home with or without a primary caregiver and is capable of managing daily activities, but is at risk of isolation, at an elevated risk of a fall, or would benefit from vitals monitoring and/or medication dispensing.

The project is being piloted with the support of KinVillage in Delta (11 seniors enrolled) and Broadmead Care Society in Victoria (15 seniors enrolled), with a goal of supporting more than 2,700 seniors and their caregivers over the next four years, and expanding to other communities around B.C. over the next 18 months. The KinVillage hub for the virtual program launched June 17, 2024. Broadmead is installing technology in homes this week, with all 15 clients set up over the next few weeks. The program is funded through the Canada-British Columbia Aging with Dignity agreement, which provides up to \$47 million over four years. This agreement bolsters B.C.'s investments to meet the

needs of seniors by enhancing access to high-quality, safe and dignified care. Funding flows to long-term care partners to support implementation and operating costs, including hiring program management and implementation staff, technology procurement, contracts for program monitoring and evaluation, and necessary renovations and equipment.

B.C. engages on Columbia River Treaty agreement-in-principle

To hear from people in Columbia Basin communities, engagement on the Columbia River Treaty agreement-in-principle will begin this summer.

On July 11, 2024, the Government of Canada and the United States announced that they have reached an agreement-in-principle (AIP) on the key elements of a modernized Columbia River Treaty. This milestone follows six years of negotia-tions and, on the Canadian side, has been informed by more than a decade of B.C. government engagement with Indigenous Nations, local governments and Columbia Basin residents. Now that an AIP is in place, the Province of B.C. will engage again with the people of the basin to describe the AIP and seek their feed-

The engagement will initially focus on providing information about the AIP and answering questions received throughout the summer to help people understand what the AIP includes and how it compares to the original trea-



ty. A video featuring representatives on the Canadian negotiation delegation explaining these details will be released in early August 2024. A summary of the AIP and answers to frequently asked questions are available on the B.C. Columbia River Treaty webhttps://engage.gov. bc.ca/columbiarivertreaty/ agreement-in-principle/. Additional resources and updates will be shared over the coming weeks.

In early September 2024, the

Province will host a virtual information session, providing another opportunity for the public to learn about the AIP, ask questions and share feedback. A recording of the session will be available afterward for those unable to attend or who wish to watch it again.

Following the information session, the Province is planning to hold a series of community meetings in the basin. The engagement taking place over the coming months provides an opportunity for the public to share how they see their interests reflected in the AIP and learn about next steps for implementing a modernized treaty.

Throughout this process, the Province will connect regularly with the Columbia River Treaty Local Governments Committee and the Columbia Basin Regional Advisory Committee. Both committees are composed of representa-tives from across the basin who have been providing suggestions and advice to the Province for more than 10 years about what an improved treaty could include. More details about engagement activities will be shared as they become available, including dates, times and registration information for the online information session and community in-person meetings. Feedback from the public will inform this process. Once a modernized treaty has been drafted, it will need to be approved by the B.C. government and ratified by the Canadian and U.S. federal governments. There is no set date for when a modernized treaty will come into effect. However, both countries have committed to getting it in place as soon as possible.

B.C. powering southern Interior growth with clean, affordable electricity

BC Hydro will invest nearly \$6 billion in capital projects across B.C.'s southern Interior over the next decade to expand the electricity grid, and upgrade its infrastructure to ensure a continued, reliable supply of clean power across

the region. "We must build out B.C.'s electrical system like never before to power our homes and businesses, to power a growing economy and to power our future," said Josie Osborne, Minister of Energy, Mines and Low Carbon Innovation. "Throughout the southern Interior and in communities across B.C., these construction projects will create thousands of good jobs over the next decade and ensure that people have access to clean, affordable and reliable electricity, when they need it and where they need it."

In January, the Province announced BC Hydro's updated 10-Year Capital Plan, which contains \$36 billion in regional and community infrastructure investments throughout B.C. - a 50% increase in investments over its previous capital plan. These new construction projects are forecasted to support 10,500 to 12,500 jobs on average annually, and will increase and maintain BC Hydro's capital investments as major projects like Site C are completed.

The plan reflects growing demand for electricity across sectors due to population growth and housing construction, increased industrial development, and people and businesses switching from fossil fuels to clean electricity, among other factors.

"In regions like the southern Interior, we are investing billions of dollars to significantly upgrade our generating facilities and transmis-sion lines to improve dam safety, replace aging or end-of-life equipment and reduce the risk of extended outages due to wildfires," said Chris O'Riley, president and CEO, BC Hydro. "These investments, along with



upgrades to our substations, and underground and overhead distribution infrastructure, will ensure BC Hydro can continue to provide clean, reliable and af-fordable electricity British Columbians rely on." The southern Interior is experiencing growth in communities like Kamloops, West Kelowna, Lillooet, 100 Mile House, Vernon, and Lake Country, among others. To meet these growing energy needs, \$5 billion is being invested in BC Hydro's generating facil-

About \$1.2 billion will go toward improvements to the La Joie dam facility on the Bridge River to address aging infrastructure and seismic vulnerabilities at the

Approximately \$3.8 billion in investments is for dam safety, equipment refurbishments, replacements and improvements to maintain continued reliable operation at facilities on the Bridge River system (Bridge River 1 and 2, Seton, Terzaghi, Lajoie), and on the Columbia system (Revelstoke, Mica, Kootenay Canal, Duncan, Seven Mile, Hugh Keenleyside).

Additionally, about \$450 million has been earmarked for crucial transmission capacity upgrades, including:

the West Kelowna Transmission and Westbank Upgrade project, which includes adding capacity at Westbank station to serve up to 26,000 more homes, as well as a new transmission connection to provide redundancy to the area, which is currently served by a single transmission

upgrades to support elec-trification at the High-land Valley Copper mine near Kamloops; and

Bridge River project, which proposes to raise the height of structures on transmission lines between Bridge River Terminal station and Kelly Lake substation.

BC Hydro is also investing in new distribution infrastructure to serve

more than 15,000 new homes in Kamloops and West Kelowna.

Approximately \$275 million will be invested in substations to:

replace end-of-life equipment at Natal substation to maintain reliable supply of energy in the area;

replace aging infrastructure, such as reactors and switchyard equipment; and

upgrade station fire protection and telecommunication systems.

BC Hydro's 10-Year Capital Plan is a key part of Powering Our Future: BC's Clean Energy Strategy. The strategy focuses on building an economy powered by clean energy, creating new jobs and opportunities, and keeping electricity af-fordable.

BC Hydro also recently launched a call for power to acquire approximately 3,000 gigawatt hours per year (GWh/y) of clean electricity. This is BC Hydro's first competitive call for power in more than 15 years. It will add 5% to its current supply, and will be the first in a series of calls for power as BC Hydro requires more power to electrify B.C.'s growing economy and reduce harmful pol-

INDIA ADVISES ITS CITIZENS TO AVOID ALL NON-ESSENTIAL TRAVEL TO LEBANON AMID ESCALATING **TENSIONS**



Beirut: Amid escalating tensions in the region, the Indian Embassy in Lebanon has advised Indians to avoid all non-essential travel to Lebanon. They have been advised to exercise caution, restrict movements, and remain in contact with the Indian Embassy in Beirut.

Taking to X, the Indian Embassy in Lebanon stated, "In view of the recent escalations in the region, Indian nationals are advised to avoid all non-essential travel to Lebanon. All Indian nationals in Lebanon are advised to exercise caution, restrict their movements, and remain in contact with the Embassy of India in Beirut through their email id: cons.beirut@mea.gov.in or the emergency phone number +96176860128."

Tensions have further escalated after the rocket attack at Golan Heights, allegedly fired by Hezbollah killed 12 children. In response to the attack at Golan Heights, The Israel Defence Forces (IDF) said that top Hezbollah commander Fuad Shukr was killed in the Israeli strike in southern Lebanon on Tuesday (local time).



INDIA TO RECORD ABOVE-NORMAL RAINFALL IN **AUGUST & SEPTEMBER: IMD**

New Delhi: India is predicted to record above-normal rainfall in August and September, with a good chance of favourable La Nina conditions developing by the end of August, the India Meteorological Department (IMD) said on Thursday.

The monsoon is critical for India's agricultural landscape, with 52 per cent of the net cultivated area relying on it. The primary rain-bearing system is also crucial for replenishing reservoirs critical for drinking water and power generation across the country.

The IMD said that rainfall over India in August and September would be 106 per cent of the long-period average of 422.8 mm.



The country has so far recorded 453.8 mm against the normal of 445.8 mm since June 1, a surplus of two per cent, owing to a wetter-than-normal July after a drier June.

Normal to above-normal rainfall is predicted in most parts of the country. Below-normal rainfall is expected in parts of the northeast, adjoining east India, Ladakh, Saurashtra, and Kutch, and pockets of central and peninsular India, IMD chief Mrutyunjay

Mohapatra said during an online press confer-

IMD Chief On Deficient Rainfall In Parts Of Western Himalayan Region. The IMD chief antici-

pated deficient rainfall in parts of the Western Himalayan region in August-September. He said above-normal

maximum temperatures are expected over most parts of the country. 'Normal to below-normal maximum temperatures are likely in some areas in the Gangetic plains, central India, and the southeast coast of India," Mohapatra said India recorded nine per cent more rainfall than normal in July, with the central region receiving 33 per cent ex-

MALDIVES PRESIDENT MOHAMED MUIZZU THANKS INDIA FOR DEBT RELIEF

Maldives President Mohamed Muizzu thanked India for its support of the island nation in easing its debt repayment and affirmed hope that New Delhi and Male would forge stronger ties and sign a free trade agreement.

Muizzu was addressing the official Independence Day function in the Maldives on Friday. During his address, he commended the administration's foreign policy, celebrating eight months of 'diplomatic success,' according to the Maldives President

President Muizzu expressed gratitude to India and China for their support in easing the Maldives' debt repay-ment, thereby enabling the country to ensure economic sovereignty. Emphasising the need to alleviate the local shortages of US dollars, he said that the Maldives government is negotiating currency swap agreements with both New Delhi and Beijing.

The Maldives President also announced that his administration is negotiating a Free Trade Agreement (FTA) with the United Kingdom and expressed hope to reach a similar agreement with India.

Notably, the Mohamed Muizzu government in the Maldives took a reconciliatory tone after ties between the two nations soured, leading to a diplomatic row. Last month, President

Muizzu also attended

the oath ceremony of Prime Minister Narendra Modi, after he took office for the third consecutive term.

Earlier this year, Muizzu sought debt relief measures in the repayment of the hefty loans taken from the country over consecutive governments. He even stated that India will continue to remain the Maldives' "closest ally" and emphasised that there was no question about it.

SHOCKER: INDIAN MAN INSERTS 2-FOOT LONG LIVE EEL ALONG WITH LIME INTO HIS RECTUM IN VIETNAM




31-year-old Indian national man faced a life-threatening medical emergency after he inserted a live eel into his anus. The incident, which occurred around noon, led to severe abdominal pain and required urgent intervention from medical professionals, so he was taken to the Viet Duc Hospital in Hanoi. The eel, approximately 65 cm long and 10 cm in circumference, was discovered within the patient's abdominal cavity following a series of diagnostic tests and imaging.

Emergency Response and Surgery

The patient arrived at the hospital's emergency department with intense abdominal pain. Initial examinations, including imaging and ultrasound, revealed the presence of a radiopaque object in the abdominal cavity. The X-ray images indicated that a large foreign object was lying

horizontally from left to right. Dr. Le Nhat Huy, deputy director of the Colorectal and Pelvic Floor Surgery Centre, explained that the hospital prompt-ly assembled a team of endoscopy experts and anesthesiologists for a colonoscopy to at-tempt removal of the eel through the anus. The colonoscopy was unsuccessful in re-moving the eel, and the patient's condition deteriorated with increasing pain. This led to an urgent decision for open abdominal surgery. Upon open-ing the abdomen, the medical team found a live eel inside, which had caused signifi-cant damage by biting through the patient's rectum and colon. Additionally, a lemon was also found within the rectum. The surgical team removed the eel and the lemon, and then addressed the damage by suturing the perforations in the rectum and colon.

Trump responded by questioning Harris' her-

"She was always of Indian heritage, and she was only promoting Indian heritage. I didn't know



she was black until a number of years ago, when she happened to turn black, and now she wants to be known as black. So I don't know, is she Indian or is she black?" CNN quoted him

2024 Honda CR-V EXL review. Classic Family Favourite

By Veeno Dewan

The popular Honda CR-V compact crossover is a top seller for the company and enters 2024 with a host of changes from 2023. Now in its sixth-generation model, there is an exterior design refresh, more technology and for the first time in Canada, a gasoline hybrid model option. The look is conservative, high quality and nicely honed.

The base gasoline engine is a mostly carryover 1.5L four-cylinder unit updated to reduce noise and vibration. The engine also gains a more effective high-response turbocharger for more constant peak power output over a wider rpm spectrum range. Output remains the same as the outgoing CR-V, with 190 horsepower and 179 lb-ft. of torque. Peak torque (1,700 -5,000 rpm) now arrives quicker.

As it was with the departing model, the 1.5

turbo is paired with a continuously varitransmission (CVT), that Honda has tweaked for a more responsive shift action. The CVT also features Step-Shift programming that simulates gear shifts at full throttle. All CR-V models come with standard all-wheel drive (AWD), except for the LX model, where it is optional. The AWD system has been updated so that it can now send up to 50 percent of engine torque to the rear wheels.

The 2023 CR-V hybrid model however has an all-new 2.0-litre Atkinson cycle four-cylinder engine (145 hp / 138 lb-ft.) paired with fourth-gen Honda's 2-motor hybrid system. Combined output is rated at 204 horsepower and 247 lb-ft. of torque and allows for about 61km of pure electric driving range. The 2024 Honda CR-V line up comprises: LX, EX-L (AWD), and Touring Hybrid. The front-

wheel drive LX \$35,125 add all-wheel drive and it is \$37,925. The Sport is \$42,075 and the EX-L is \$44,275. The top-tier Touring Hybrid is \$49,775. We evaluated the EX-L version that adds exterior upgrades, including fog lights, option-al one-touch power tailgate, and a power moonroof. Additions also include: a 7-inch touchscreen display, satellite navigation, and a premium sound system plus an optional full-color heads-up display. The EX-L offers a range of advanced safety features, including blind spot monitoring and rear cross-traffic alert.

The CR-V features a dash mounted seven-inch infotainment touchscreen with wired Apple CarPlay and Android Auto, while the EX-L and Touring trims get a nine-inch screen and wireless smartphone connectivity, plus a wireless phone char-ger. Thankfully, Honda kindly retained the easier to use multimedia volume knob.

Interior highlights include a neat high quality, well-designed and comfortable cabin with good visibility, a huge amount of storage front and rear, a large center console and new seats. The dash is very well designed with stylish hidden vents behind the Honda Civ-

look dash-panel. Ergonomics are great the display screen bright and clear to read and there are sensible controls and knobs. Meanwhile, rear legroom is increased along with cargo capacity to 1,028 L, increasing to 1,113 L total by lowering the load floor in the LX, Sport, and EX-L models. With the 60/40 split rear seat folded, 2,166 L of total cargo space is available.

On the road, the CR-V is no track star, but it feels refined and composed when compared with the competition.

Around corners, the CR-V stays composed and under control. The responsive steering offers enough feedback to smooth over bumps and small potholes and the suspension is pliable.

The CR-V is no Honda Si and errs more to comfort than performance, with the 1.5-liter turbo-4 churning out 190 hp and 179 lb-ft of torque with no turbo lag detected. Three console operated drive modes are a handy touch with Normal/Śnow and Econ modes. Road and wind noise is well insulated. Fuel economy is rated at: (Regular 87) 8.4 / 7.1 / 7.8 L / 100 km (city / highway / combined). Down side are few, towing capacities is low at only 1,000 lb of capacity and the CV-R is not as sporty

as its competitors in the acceleration and handling department, not that it will matter to most Honda buyers who value reliability and longevity in their vehicles.

To sum up, the new 2024 Honda CR-V continues the best attributes of the previous generation CR-V with a respectable number of improvements and remains an extraordinarily strong contender in the compact family CUV market. No doubt, it is poised to continue as a strong competitor in the segment and a sales winner for Honda. Fit, finish and equipment levels are good, Highly recommended for families everywhere.



Tax changes drive surge in commercial real estate deals

The recent changes in capital gains taxes have spurred a surge in commercial real estate activity, according to Financial Post.

Colliers Canada reported that these changes, which took effect on June 25, led to a significant increase in asset sales. Property owners rushed to divest before the new tax rules applied, resulting in Colliers closing 156 deals from June 1 to June 30. This number represents a 26 percent increase compared to June 2023 and marks the highest number of June transactions in a decade.

Adam Jacobs, the national head of research at Colliers, highlighted the impact of the tax change. He noted, "It was a big surprise for us, of course, because the commercial market was down."

"Everyone had an opportunity to do a deal at the old capital gains tax, so I think that was what we saw people do: 'I think I'll just cash out now and do the deal before I have to deal with more taxes in the future.' It's already a difficult market, and it's getting more difficult," he continued.

The commercial real estate

sector has faced significant challenges since the pandemic-induced lockdowns. Coldwell Banker Richard Ellis (CBRE) reported that the national office vacancy rate soared to 13.4 percent in the fourth quarter of 2020, the highest level since 2004.



The plan unfolded in the early hours of April 14, when gunshots were fired outside Khan's residence. The investigation into the shooting has led to several arrests, with the authorities working to piece together the full extent of the conspiracy. The attack was reportedly coordinated by the Lawrence Bishnoi gang, with Anmol Bishnoi, the gangster's brother, publicly taking responsibility in a Facebook post.


